ber of the MU law faculty since 1970. Before that, he practiced law in Chicago with the law firm of Kirkland & Ellis and served on the law faculty of the University of North Dakota.

In 1968-69 he was a Humboldt Fellow at the University of Freiburg, Germany. During 1980-81 he served as a Fulbright Scholar at the Max Planck Institute for Foreign and International Private Law at the University of Hamburg in Germany, studying German civil procedure reforms.

In 1989-90 he was a Fulbright and Humboldt Scholar and in the summer of 1992 a Max Planck Society fellow in Hamburg, conducting a comparative study of the law governing professional-client contracts. He is a member of the American Law Institute, and of the Board of Editors of the American Journal of Comparative Law.

Prof. Fisch has published widely in the areas of comparative law and procedure. He teaches Comparative Law, Constitutional Law, International Law, International Protection of Human Rights Seminar, International Moot Court, Professional Responsibility and European Union Law.

CLE credit for mock trial judging

Local lawyers are needed as judges for an undergraduate mock trial regional competition at the MU Law School on Friday, Feb. 23 and Saturday, Feb. 24. The Missouri Bar will authorize up to six hours of selfstudy CLE credit for mock trial judging activity.

Columbia College and the University of Missouri-Columbia are hosting the competition, which serves as a competitive forum for teams to earn bids to the National Championship Tournament. Judges will score a printed ballot with established criteria and rule on evidentiary objections governed by an evidence code similar to the Federal Rules of Evidence.

This year's case is a criminal case involving an alleged assault of a protective services worker by an individual on probation. The rounds begin at 3 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. on Friday and 9 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. on Saturday.
